







COVID-19 and the Black Community

- “In Cleveland, one of the most segregated cities in America, [the numbers are haunting](#): At least 70% of the total cases in the city in which race is known involve African Americans. Black residents make up slightly more than 45% of the city's population.”
- “Though Black Ohioans comprise 14% of the state’s population, they make up 27% of the COVID-19 hospitalization load, [state data shows](#).”
- “Close to 22,000 Black and Hispanic Americans would still be alive, as of December, if these groups died of the virus at the same rate as White Americans, [according to Oxfam](#).”

Fund Purpose

The Cleveland Black Futures Fund was launched in late 2020 with the overarching goal to strengthen the ecosystem of Black leaders and Black-serving organizations in Greater Cleveland by providing intentional resources to help grow **organizational infrastructure and capacity**.

Since its inception, the fund has amassed more than \$4 million, including a recent \$1 million grant from Facebook as part of its commitment to support Black businesses, creators and nonprofits.

Phase II of the Greater Cleveland COVID-19 Rapid Response Fund

Generally, grants are made for one to two years; although they may be longer, given program priorities. Unless specifically notified by the foundation, applicants may apply for continued support of a previously funded purpose or project. The foundation cannot fund projects already underway or projects that have already been completed. Please submit your request well in advance of your project's start date.

2. Obtain a username and password by completing our online request form, which will require the following information:

- Organization name
- Organization address
- EIN number
- Name of organization's executive director
- Executive director's email address
- Authorized users (including name, title and email address for each)

3. Establish or update your organization profile:

Your organization profile must be completed before submitting a grant inquiry or full application. Your profile helps to showcase your organization before foundation staff. You may update your organization profile on our Grants Login platform.

4. Submit a grant inquiry:

The foundation requires all grant applicants to first submit an online grant inquiry, outlining basic information about the proposed project. Inquiries may be submitted at any time and will be reviewed on a rolling basis according to the calendar below. We recommend submitting one inquiry per proposed project. If it is determined that your project fits the foundation's guidelines, you will be asked (within a few weeks) to submit a full application. Please note that an invitation to submit a full application does not guarantee funding at any level.



- If awarded a grant, when would your organization begin proposed activities?
- Please describe any partnerships that are important to your work.
- Based on your experience, please explain how COVID-19 has affected the community you serve and your organization.
